Michael Wimmer/ EDUCULT/Vienna: Lecture on cultural policy at the Janáček Academy for Music and Performing Arts in Brno

The intention of the meeting is to develop with the participants a concrete idea of what cultural policy is about and in which way cultural policy influences cultural management (and vice versa).

After an introduction on the main trends in cultural policy on the different political, administrative and institutional levels in Europe the participants are invited to discuss their projects, project ideas and perspectives against the background of their cultural policy relevant experiences. The participants will learn to differentiate the term cultural policy alongside different intentions, addressees, actors, instruments and outcomes which influence their practical efforts.

For the participants there will be the chance to discuss their projects also in one-on-one interviews with the lecturer.

The participants are warmly invited to contribute actively with the own experiences, assessments and perspectives and questions.
