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18th Annual Leoš Janáček International Competition in Brno

🖬 piano, organ 14-22 September. 2012

- 1. The competition is announced for Piano and Organ. The applicants cannot exceed 35 years of age on the opening day of the competition.
- 2. The competition in Organ will be held on 14-21 September, 2012, and in Piano will be held on 17-22 September, 2012. A detailed schedule will be put on the website of the competition.

3. The competition consists of three rounds.

4. Competition performances are public.

5. The jury is appointed for each category separately. The juries are consists of important Czech and foreign artists and experts. Decisions of the juries are final.

6. Financial awards are announced for each field separately:

1 st	prize	CZK	100,000
2^{nd}	prize	CZK	70,000
3 rd	prize	CZK	40,000

The jury can give special awards for the best interpretation of the chosen compositions.

The financial awards above are subject to tax and/or other possible deductions in accordance with laws and regulations valid in the Czech Republic

7. The jury reserves the right not to award individual prizes, to divide them (ex æquo) or to unite them.

- 8. The title "Laureate of Leoš Janáček International Competition in Brno", together with diplomas with their names, titles and prizes belong to all prize winners. Holders of honourable mention and other prizes and bonuses will also get diplomas without any claim to the title of laureate.
- 9. The organizer reserves the right to record competition performances. Participants do not have a right to any payment for it. Competition performances of the candidates can be recorded and broadcasted by television and radio.

The competition repertoire for PIANO:

Round I:

- a) Two concert etudes of virtuoso character, at least one of them must be from Chopin's Op. 10 or Op. 25 (except Op. 10 No. 3 and No. 6, Op. 25 No. 7)
- b) One movement from a sonata by Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, Dusík. The movement must be in a sonata form.
- c) L. Janáček: two parts from the cycle "On an Overgrown Path" (based on own choice)

Max. duration of the performance is 30 minutes. Playing by heart is required. The order of the compositions depends on each competitor.

Round II:

Recital – program must include one composition by Leoš Janáček from the following selection: Sonata 1.X.1905

In the Mists

On an Overgrown Path (at least 5 random parts based on the candidate's choice) and futher compositions from at least two different style periods.

The selection must not include the composition performed in the 1st round. Total duration of the recital is 40–50 minutes. Playing by heart is required. The order of the compositions depends on each competitor.

2. A composition based on the candidate's choice.

The selection must not include the composition interpreted in the first, second or third (point 1) round. Max. duration of the performance is 40 minutes.

In case of interest, the organizer is able to provide a registrator.

- 10. Participants can notify possible changes in repertoire by 31 July, 2012.
- 11. The Faculty of Music organizes **accommodation** in student dormitary Astorka (IVU centrum Astorka, Novobranská 3, 602 00 Brno). The participants of the first round have to pay themselves the accommodation (cost of the accommodation will be available for download on the website of the competition). From the second round the accommodation for the advancing competitors is paid by the organizer (only in student dormitory Astorka). If the candidates choose different accommodation facilities, it will be at their own expenses.
- 12. Transport and boarding are arranged and paid by participants themselves.
- 13. In case of late arrival at the competition performance or breaking the rules or status of the competition, participants will be eliminated from the competition.
- 14. Application deadline and payment of the administrative fee: 31 May, 2012

Only electronically filled in application is invalid and can not be registered if it is not sent with all the attachments in the relevant prescribed form.
