1. The international interpretative competition is announced for voice. The applicants can not exceed 28 years of age on the opening day of the competition.
2. The competition consists of three rounds. The third round will be held in cooperation with a professional orchestra.
3. Competition performances are public.
4. The competition repertoire:

**1<sup>st</sup> Round**

- a) 3 songs by Leoš Janáček of own choice (it is possible to include a part from "The Diary of One Who Disappeared")
- b) 1 aria or song, 17<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> century
- c) 1 folk song adapted by a composer from the performer's country

Length of performance: 10 - 15 min

**2<sup>nd</sup> Round**

- a) 3 songs by at least 2 composers: F. Schubert, R. Strauss, G. Mahler, H. Wolf, B. Martinů
- b) a song cycle or a part of a song cycle by a Czech composer written after 1950, length: 10 minutes at least; foreign participants can perform a work of art (written after 1950) by a composer of their country
- c) 1 concert or opera aria by W. A. Mozart of own choice

Length of performance: 20 – 30 min

**3<sup>rd</sup> Round**

- a) own choice of one aria from operas by Leoš Janáček or Bohuslav Martinů from the following repertoire:

- scene of Schoolmaster from Act II  
"Bud'to mám těžistě pohyblivé"

"The Greek Passion"

- aria of Živný

All compositions must be performed by heart, in original key and in original language.

**5. Prizes:**

- 1<sup>st</sup> prize CZK 100,000
- 2<sup>st</sup> prize CZK 70,000
- 3<sup>st</sup> prize CZK 40,000

The jury can give special awards for the best interpretation of the chosen compositions.

The financial awards above are subject to tax and/or other possible deductions in accordance with laws and regulations valid in the Czech Republic.

Within thirty days after the deadline participants will be informed whether their application will have been accepted.

7. Participants can notify possible changes in repertoire by 31 July 2009.
8. **Accommodation** during the participation in the competition is provided and paid by the organizer.
9. **Transport and boarding** are arranged and paid by participants themselves.
10. In case of late arrival at the competition performance or breaking the rules or status of the competition, participants will be eliminated from the competition.
11. The jury consists of important Czech and foreign artists and experts. Their decisions are final. Results of all rounds will be made public.
12. The jury reserves the right not to award individual prizes, to divide them (ex æquo) or to unite them.
13. The title "Laureate of Leoš Janáček International Competition", together with diplomas with their names, titles and prizes belong to all prize bearers. Bearers of honourable mention and other prizes and bonuses will also get diplomas without any claim to the title of laureate.
14. The organizer reserves the right to record competition performances. Participants do not have a right to any payment for it. Competition performances of the candidates can be recorded and broadcasted by television and radio.
15. Competition will take place from 7 – 12 September 2009 in Concert Hall, Faculty of Music of JAMU, Brno. The third round and prize-giving ceremony will take place on 12 September 2009 at 6:00 p.m.
